

IWW-RELATED MOVIE POSTERS MODIFICATION INSTRUCTIONS

Any constructive suggestions to improve this site are appreciated!

The movie posters are for a MAC and are in pdf and odg formats. They only can be modified in odg. Pdf. is what you'll need to save in to send or to print. One of the "joys" of computers is when they do the thinking for you, so some of the titles come after "the" rather than alphabetically. I will be adding new posters as we show new films.

Substituting your info: Most of the work you'll be doing will be substituting your info for the current info on the flier and resizing.

To substitute your information with the info already on the flier, click on what's written and/or click on the type icon at the bottom of the page. Drag the cursor backward and then type in your info while it's highlighted.

To change the font or size of the letters go to the boxes with the arrows to the right of them at the left side of top of the page and scroll down to what you want. The type needs to be highlighted.

To change the size of any of the graphics, go to "format" at the top of the desktop, scroll down to position and size. Make sure the keep ratio box is checked. Then type in the appropriate numbers in either Height or Width.

To send or print, go to the top of the desktop to file, scroll down to export as a pdf. Click on it, then a button will appear with export on it and ask you where you want to export it to. The desktop is a good, accessible place and on the left of the smaller window.

Organizing For Movies: Most of the movies are labor orientated, though some are about people's movements, corporate power, etc. Our branch usually shows a women-orientated film in March for Woman's Day, something about political prisoners, martyrs or repressed people's movements for "November, We Remember" and something lighter for December and the Holidays because the rest of the year's films are so serious. I include a discussion only on movies that were an hour and ½ or less long, so I'm not at the venue all night.

I have a posting list of various posting spots organized into areas around town. I also put the movie announcement in the Weekly calender here and on all the various progressive calenders.

If appropriate for the movie's theme, I get other progressive organizations to cosponsor so we can use their email lists as well.

Tabling: While obviously trying to educate ourselves and the public, one of the main reasons for showing the movies is to have an information table there to help spread the word about the IWW and our ideas, get folks coming to meetings, joining the union and organizing their workplaces. The posters, beside advertizing the movie, work as silent agitators.
